BIRTH OCCURRING IN AN AIRCRAFT REGISTERED IN THE UNITED KINGDOM



(Return for Purposes of Section 83 of the Civil Aviation Act, 1982)

The owner of an aircraft registered in the United Kingdom is required by the Civil Aviation (Births, Deaths and Missing Persons) Regulations, 1948, as amended, as soon as practicable but not later than six months after the occurrence in any part of the world of a birth in the aircraft, to transmit to the Civil Aviation Authority a return in respect of every such birth in accordance with the form set out below and containing the particulars indicated therein. If however the aircraft has been bonafide demised, let or hired out for a period exceeding fourteen days to any other person by the owner thereof and no pilot, commander, navigator or operative member of the crew of the aircraft is in the employment of the owner, this return shall be completed by the person to whom the aircraft has been so demised, let or hired out.

This form, when completed, should be forwarded to the **Civil Aviation Authority, Aircraft Registration Section, Shared Service Centre, Aviation House, Gatwick Airport, RH6 0YR**. The section is open to the public at the above address between 1000 and 1600 hours Monday to Friday. NOTES:

- (a) Day and month if words, year in figures.
- (b) Approximate position, eg '40 miles west of Lisbon', 'over Dieppe', 'over Northern France'.
- (c) Full forenames of child.
- (d) 'Boy' or 'Girl' as the case may be.
- (e) Forenames in full and followed by surname; surnames to be written in block letters. If child is illegitimate ((see (8) over) the particulars relating to the father must not be recorded in the return unless at the joint request of the mother and of the person acknowledging himself to be the father of the child, in which case such person shall, as well as the mother, sign a completed form of return as informant.
- (f) Forenames in full and married surname followed by the word 'formerly' and the maiden surname.
- (g) The informant's full names, relationship (if any) to the child, and full postal address should be stated.

Except in the circumstances mentioned at (e) above only one person (usually the mother or father) should act as informant.
